## Do not plant new trees in the right of way

Trees may not be planted in road right of way (ROW). ROW is generally land between your property line and the street. If new trees are planted in the ROW,

## Safety reminder for your natural gas delivery system

Sioux Center Municipal Utilities delivers natural gas via underground piping to each meter. Piping beyond the meter is customer's responsibility. If you have buried piping beyond the meter, have it checked periodically to ensure continued safe, reliable operation.

It is extremely unlikely that a gas leak will occur, but customers should always be prepared, as natural gas is flammable.

SCMU natural gas pipelines are monitored to maintain service and safety. You can be prepared to recognize a leak by smell ("skunk" smell added to natural gas), sight (ground frosting, dead vegetation), or sound (hissing).

### Only recycle these items:

**Plastics #1-7:** with recycle symbol number 1-7, rinsed/clean  
Plastic milk jugs, detergent bottles, soap bottles, etc., clean

**Paper:** office paper, envelopes, newspaper, magazines, mail

**Cardboard:** corrugated, food boxes, packaging, etc., clean

**Aluminum:** Cans, trays, foil, etc. rinsed/clean

**Tin cans:** rinsed/clean

**Metal lids:** rinsed/clean
